
Parent-Pay

School-community-spirit...

Children from Rockingham have been enjoying weekly reading sessions with Lilford. It's always so lovely to see how our older children show such care towards the younger children in the school and 'reading-buddies' on Tuesdays is a great representation of this.



Thank you for your kind donations of games for our lunchtime club. I spotted a lovely moment yesterday where children from across the school were gathered around a box of magic tricks. I wonder where they will be trying out their new skills...stay alert!

Today our Year 5s found out just how magical maths can be as they headed to the Frontier centre for the PDET maths day! First the children had an amazing mathemagician showing tricks for different times tables, wowing them with predictions and even changing money into different amounts right before their eyes using fractions. The children were encouraged to look for patterns and to be curious with the maths they were doing.

After the talk, we hit our first challenge. By some miraculous folding, the children were able to turn an A4 piece of paper into a perfect pentagon, and even then tried to connect these into a dodecahedron with...mixed results. They never gave up though and when called time asked if they could do it again when they got back to school!

Next came the maths escape room which was actually a box full of padlocks and secret compartments with mathematical clues. With excellent teamwork, determination and a hunt for clues, the children came so close to undoing the box, with both groups only having one more clue to solve before stopping the timer!

Last but not least, a challenge of shape and logic. The children were tasked with building a cube from the various strewn pieces of cushion, matching up colours to create a flower and attempting the tower of Hanoi, which one of our groups actually managed to get all the way to the final block of possibilities!
