What an amazing day at Whipsnade Rockingham had! First we headed around on a tour of Europe and Asia, seeing an amazing display of elephant behaviour with them being observed climbing on logs to help them reach the top of the food baskets and making such effective use of their trunks. After lunching in the shelter, we headed off to the Giraffe behaviour workshop. The children became instant scientists, armed with clipboards we recorded the behaviour of our chosen giraffes, observing them closely every 15 seconds. We used this knowledge of animal behaviour to investigate some other fascinating animals with Jack and Logan doing some expert hippo spotting. One group also had the pleasure of the keepers in the butterfly house showing the whole life cycle of a butterfly before our eyes.
