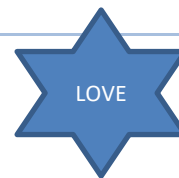

## REMINDER OF ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN TO CONTROL THE SPREAD OF COVID INFECTION IN OUR SCHOOL

- ✓ If anyone in school becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or high temperature or has a loss of or change in their normal sense of taste or smell, they must be sent home and advised to obtain a free PCR test;
- ✓ If a pupil displays Coronavirus symptoms whilst at school they will be immediately isolated and sent home with instructions to obtain a free PCR test;


